After the reinstatement of democratic regimes, the majority of South American countries experienced a succession of problems with governance. In this context, the Andean region is notable for the quantity and gravity of the crises of governance it has encountered. Ms. Sampó's book, *Crisis de gobernabilidad, desafios a la seguridad regional*, focuses on

the relationship between these crises and the regional security agenda. The book examines two dimensions of this relationship: the "secularization" of democracy in the Western Hemisphere, and the emergence and escalation of transnational phenomena that result from the erosion of state capacities.




Jorge Ayala
