

Mr. Steve Millard is a Silicon Valley entrepreneur and co-founder of several NASDAQ companies including: Equatorial Communications, now GTE; Telebit Corporation, now Cisco; Packet Technologies, later Stratacom, now Cisco; Metricom, later the Paul Allen Group; and Com 21. Three of these companies achieved peak market valuations of over one billion dollars. Currently, he's cofounder of Pathfinderpartners, an organization working closely with US National Security Groups in their anti-terrorism activities. Previously he was vice president of a Fortune 500 Company.

Boards, past and present, include The Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania; the Entrepreneurial Research Center at the Wharton School; The School of Public Policy, University of California, Berkeley; The Kellogg School, Northwestern University; and the World War II Memorial in Washington, DC.

He's a former president of the Kellogg Alumni Association and director of fund raising for the School. He has lectured and taught at: Kellogg, Wharton where he's given the Musser Schoemaker lecture; the Darden School, University of Virginia; Oxford University; and VMI.

He's an investor in Silicon Valley, as a limited partner in numerous venture capital funds, and an advisor to other funds. He holds a BS from the University of Pennsylvania and an MBA from the Kellogg School, Northwestern University.

He's a member of the February Group, Washington, DC; the Family Club, San Francisco; and the Burlingame Country Club, Hillsborough, California.

He is married to the former Linda Dyer of Hillsborough, California, who is executive director of Lewa US, a Kenyan Wild Life Conservancy owned and operated by her British cousins who have ranched in Kenya for 100 years.
