 - A non-threatening internet site for adaptive planning and collaboration with coalition partners and inter-agencies
- **Multi-national Force SOPs**
 - 26 nations standardize the approach to task force response
- **Multi-national Planning and Augmentation Teams (MPAT)**
 - The coalition variant to the Standing Joint Force Headquarters
- **Language translation tools**
 - Text-to-text, Instant-messaging, PowerPoint, and voice translation
- **Collaboration tools for planning and execution**
 - InfoWork Space (IWS), Adaptive Course of Action (ACOA)
- **Coalition exercises test the coalition seams and explore interoperability and compatibility**
