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# Part of America's History



- U.S. Marshals established by Judiciary Act of 1789
- Original administrative representatives of the President outside of Washington, D.C.
- Took census, collected taxes and disbursed funds in addition to broad Federal law enforcement responsibilities



# Broad Legal Authority



- Today U.S. Marshals have authority to carry out Federal law with powers of sheriff

## ■ Courthouse Security




- U.S. Marshals provide security for Federal courts (over 800 facilities with over 2000 Federal judges)
- Partnership with U.S. Attorneys in litigation and Task Force operations such as ATTF

# Missions



- Security of Federal courts and enforcement of court orders, writs and arrest warrants
- Secure confinement and transportation of Federal detainees
- Witness Protection Program
- Asset seizure, maintenance and disposal
- Special Operations

# Special Operations with Other Agencies



- Advanced Electronic Surveillance Capabilities
- Security for sensitive transports of military ordnance, critical deployment of CDC medical teams and FEMA operations
- Olympics
- Naval Ordnance Test Area, Vieques, PR
- Etc.

# Special Deputations



- Director U.S. Marshals Service authorized to deputize federal, state and local law enforcement officers

# Special Deputations



- Federal/state/local Task Forces throughout country

# Special Deputations



- Special Operations such as Olympics, Vieques and natural disasters
- Approx 9000 Special Deputations in FY 2002

# Fugitive Apprehension



## ■ Tactical Breaching



- Over 50,000 Federal Arrest Warrants a year

# Prisoner Services



- Responsible for over 37,000 prisoners, most in state/local facilities

# Justice Prisoner Air Transport Service (JPATS)



- Over 250,000 prisoners moved in FY 2002
- INS and BOP use JPATS
- Fleet includes aircraft, buses and vans

# JPATS as Emergency Resource



- JPATS used extensively to transport officials in national emergency

# JPATS for Special Missions



- JPATS used for transport of high security prisoners and protected witnesses

# Seized Asset Management



- Seize/manage/dispose of 50,000 assets per year
- \$1 billion in asset value

# Seized Asset Management



- Managed assets include cash, boats, planes, land, facilities
