
ASIA-PACIFIC CENTER MISSION

 - 140 Fellows from 29 countries






CONFERENCE PROGRAM



- Fosters understanding of current U.S. policy and solicits regional views
- Serves as a forum for professional exchanges among policy makers, practitioners and subject matter experts
- Provides focused consideration of high-interest security issues
- Since June 1995: conducted more than 99 conferences with over 6400 participants from 66 countries



RESEARCH & PUBLICATIONS PROGRAM

- Publishes policy-relevant analyses consistent with DoD and PACOM guidance
- Provides additional research to support the College program
- Conducts independent research looking at future issues
- Provides expertise to shape future conference topics
