





Educational Methodology: Seminar Focused



- **Graduate-level education**
 - **Foster critical, analytical, conceptual thinking**
 - **Small, diverse / interagency classes (13 students/seminar)**
 - **Limited contact hours (13 hrs/week requiring preparation)**
 - **Emphasis on the core component (70%)**
 - **Use of case studies and simulations**
- **Standards - Integrated Curriculum**
 - **400-500 pages/week reading**
 - **Seminar discussion**
 - **Numerous papers**
 - **End-of-semester oral evaluations**
