**Dr. Murhaf Jouejati, Professor**

Murhaf Jouejati is a Syrian-born specialist on Middle East affairs, particularly Syrian politics and the Levant. He is currently a Professor of Middle East Studies at the National Defense University's Near East South Asia Center for Strategic Studies. Dr. Jouejati is also adjunct Professor of Political Science and International Affairs at the George Washington University, as well as an adjunct

scholar at the Middle East Institute in Washington DC.

Dr. Jouejati has over two decades of experience researching and working on the political, social and economic aspects of the Middle East. In 2004-2006, he served as the Director of the Middle East Studies Program and Visiting Professor at the George Washington University's Elliott School for International Affairs. From 2000 to 2002, Dr. Jouejati was a resident scholar at the Middle East Institute. He taught at George Washington University and American University from 2000 to 2004. In 1998-2000, he served as an advisor to the European Commission Delegation in Damascus and as focal point for several EU-funded regional development programs, including civil society projects. Before assuming that position, Dr. Jouejati served with the United Nations Development Program (UNDP), first as the National Program Officer in Syria (1993 to 1994), where he headed the UNDP's program section, and then as a consultant to the Bureau of Arab States in New York (1994-1995). In 1981-85, he served as the Information officer of the US-Arab Chamber of Commerce in Washington.

As an advisor to the Syrian delegation to the Middle East peace talks (1991-1994 and 1996), Dr. Jouejati commands an in-depth knowledge of the Syrian government as well as Syrian foreign policy. Dr. Jouejati has written extensively on Syria and the Middle East. As a specialist on Syrian foreign policy, he was invited to testify before the 9/11 Commission and the Senate Foreign Relations Committee. Dr. Jouejati has been a frequent guest on NPR's All Things Considered as well as other television and radio news programs, such as PBS' The News Hour with Jim Lehrer, ABC News' Nightline, CNN, BBC, Al-Jazeera, and others.

Dr. Jouejati holds an M.A. in Arab area studies from Georgetown University and a Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of Utah.
