Dr. Fariborz (Fred) Mokhtari has been a member of the faculty at the Near East South Asia Center for Strategic Studies (NESA) at National Defense University (NDU) in Washington, DC, since August of 2002. He had previously taught Political Science at Norwich University in Vermont for nearly twenty years, where he also served as department chairman, director of military graduate studies, and special assistant to the president of the university. Dr. Mokhtari's fields of specialization include Comparative Politics, Political Philosophy, Public Policy Administration, and Economics. His interests include political economy of development, international security and diplomacy, as well as issues relating to the Middle East and the South China Sea region. He has traveled extensively to the former Soviet Union, Thailand, Indonesia, Singapore, Jordan, Israel, Turkey, Greece, and the People's Republic of Mongolia, among others.

He has edited two volumes, *Persian Gulf Beyond Desert Storm* (1993) and *Peacemaking, Peacekeeping, and Coalition Warfare* (1994), managed conferences, delivered presentations widely, and written numerous articles, most recently including:
