



- Grant Hall's historic courtroom, site of the 1865 military tribunal of the Lincoln assassination conspirators










Virtual Library - URL








Virtual Library - Hours







Academic technologies at NDU are avpoortable

We fulfill this mission through teaching courses, conducting workshops, and providing one-on-one instruction at every stage of the writing process.

Welcome

Hello, students.

Welcome to NDULAs Writing Center instructors, we are here to assist you in completing your writing assignments. Whether the project is large or small, we are here to listen, offer guidance, and provide strategies and approaches for producing your best writing.

Here are a few points we would like you to remember as you immerse yourself in writing

Writing thrives in a supportive environment.

People who write often describe their most conductive writing environment and the steps they take in creating it. Some writers write while listening to soft music. Others prefer writing while facing a window. Others write during quiet hours at their kitchen fable. Writing Center instructors here at NOU aim to offer a sale and supportive space for you as you write. So, refer to Writing Center faculty by their first names. Come in. Sit comfortably. Discuss your writing openly — its successes, challenges and everything in between. The Writing Center is a place for conversation and dislogue.

Writing is a process.

Writing is difficult work. Period. As writing center faculty, we encourage you to view writing as more of a process than a product. The five main steps of the writing process are prewriting, organizing, drafting, revising, and proofleading. Revising might be the toughest stage as you prepare to rethink, restructure, and rewrite your findings and analyses. American author Verlyn Klickenborg said it best when he sald, "All writing is revision." Writing Center faculty are here to help you through every stage of the process from prewriting to revising and proofreading.

The Writing Center is for ALL writers.

Although writing centers have been around for decades now (over thirty years), they remain tasked with the duty of ridding themselves of labels such as "fix-fi" clinics or remedial labs for "bad" writers. Even the best authors tell stories of tossing out entire manuscripts and starting over only to repeat the process several times at the demand of and with the assistance of editors and publishers. In adulatity writing is a practice. Hardly anyone gets it "right" the first time, and the Whiting Center is here to assist ALL writers in the journey.
