Education Programs: Seminar based, interactive/experiential learning.

 - o IT Program Management
- Prepare graduates who will:

 - o Effectively communicate with leaders and decision makers
 - o Make ethical decisions based on the shared values of the Profession of Arms
- 40 different courses with over 200 offerings/year

Flexible Learning Options: Student centered to meet their ops tempo needs and resource constraints:

- Full time: 14 weeks (Advanced Management Program Chief Information Officer Certificate)
- Full time: 10 months (Master's Degree in Cyber Leadership; Potential JPME Program
- Part time: eResident (5 weeks (1 week in-residence, 4 weeks on-line) 3 credit course)

 Distributed Learning (12 week interactive on-line seminar 3 credit course)

 Electives (6 week in-resident seminar 2 credit course)
- Education in Context: Courses designed for key stakeholders (CYBERCOM, Air Force, etc)
- 4 years to complete a Certificate; 7 years to complete the Master's Degree
- Many students continually return for courses to keep relevant in these dynamic domains
- Academic Partners: Students may transfer 9 15 credits to over 30 partner Universities for a technical or nontechnical Master's or Ph.D. program if a student prefers to earn a degree in a different but related field
